



SAPNA WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE LYELL BROUGHAM ON HIS ACORN HONORARY FELLOWSHIP:

Lyell Brougham RN, MNSc, BN (Clinical), Di App Sc, ICU Cert, FACORN (Hon).

Service to perioperative nursing through the demonstration of outstanding skills in education, policy, research and/or management

Lyell has held positions at the Royal Adelaide Hospital for over 35 years as unit manager of the PACU for 29 years and as nurse educator for 9 years. He has also been a clinical lecturer in nursing at Adelaide University.

Lyell completed a Masters in Nursing Science Nursing Practice and Research. His areas of interest include acute pain management, hypothermia, post anaesthesia recovery nursing, clinical research and nursing conceptual clinical frameworks.

He has published and presented within his areas of interest and was a contributory author writing the chapter 'Post Anaesthesia' in *Perioperative Nursing: An Introductory 2008* by Brigid M. Gillespie, Lois Hamlin, Marilyn Richardson-Tench, and Menna Davies.

Service to perioperative nursing at a national and/or international level

Lyell Brougham has been an active member of SAPNA and ACORN for over 20 years from 1997. At SAPNA he had held the position of President on two occasions, Secretary, Treasurer, and Website. Lyell was awarded life membership to SAPNA in 2010 for his passion and dedication to perioperative nursing.

Lyell has been a regular speaker at SAPNA conferences, providing education in the area of his specialty practice perianaesthesia nursing.

Lyell has been a Chairperson of the South Australian Recovery Interest Group.

Lyell served two terms on the ACORN Board in 2002 - 2006 and 2012 – 2014. He was Chair of the Website Committee and undertook a review and revision of the ACORN website in 2012-2014.

Lyell has presented at many ACORN conferences as a talented and knowledgeable speaker. He was a regular session convener at ACORN conferences.

In 2014, when ACORN webinar education commenced Lyell supported this new virtual platform with his understanding of the technology. This involved editing all the presentations so that they were word perfect. Lyell's knowledge as an experienced perioperative nurse was able to prevent any edited information losing its true meaning. Lyell believed that the recorded presentations needed to be a very high quality, because they would likely be paused, re-listened to and played over and over again.

Many of these recordings are still in use today and are a tribute to his committed work for ACORN. For the first five years this was done on a voluntary basis, and in the last few years Lyell was offered a small honorarium.

Service to the wider professional nursing community

Lyell's ongoing education of many nurses who have heard him speak, were under his guidance at the Royal Adelaide hospital and the University of Adelaide have benefited from his wealth of knowledge and his eagerness to impart this to others.

Lyell has been a peer reviewer of the International Journal Evidence Based Healthcare.
