SAPNA COACHING & MENTORING PROGRAM

SAPNA's coaching and mentoring program is underway, with 2 of the 3 sessions now completed. The training has been provided by Kerrie Akkermans of PD Training and hosted by Burnside Hospital, Toorak Gardens.

Feedback from participants has been very positive! It's such a valuable opportunity for perioperative nurses from different hospitals to share their experiences and collaborate with each other.

We have delved into the difference between coaching and mentoring and why they matter in the workplace. The coaching approach is useful for skill development and setting short term goals – a beneficial approach for those of us working in busy perioperative departments! The program was heavily subsidised by SAPNA, which gave an opportunity for SAPNA members to access this training at an affordable price.

Would coaching skills be beneficial for you in your professional practice? Here are some of the practice points we have discussed in the group.

- Use stories in coaching. This grounds the information in personal experience and illustrates the impact of the information shared.
- Spend twice as much time listening and half as much time talking.
- Help your junior colleagues to find their own solution before offering one this builds resourcefulness.
- To help build situational awareness, suggest that your junior colleagues practice scanning the room as part of their regular practice.

And many more insights!

I would encourage everyone who is involved in teaching students, graduate nurses or staff who are new to perioperative nursing to consider using a coaching approach in their work.


Katrina Webb OAM is a triple Gold Medal winning Paralympian who turned her disability into one of her greatest strengths.



2024 Judith Berry Perioperative Excellence Award

Would you like to be the next recipient of our Judith Berry Perioperative Excellence Award? We would like to invite all members to nominate a colleague or self apply for this award. The Judith Berry Perioperative Nurse Excellence Award will be awarded to a perioperative nurse that has demonstrated one or more of the following, relating to the SAPNA tenets:

CARE – Contributed to the advancement of safe patient care and/or Contributed to the advancement of care of a colleague, or the profession.

Vision – Provided a vision for perioperative nursing in their Hospital or unit and/or undertaken research or taken direct action that promotes the vision and image of perioperative nursing.

Excellence – Demonstrated excellence in perioperative practice (Clinical) and/or demonstrated excellence in perioperative practice (Management)

The Award

The Award is a \$500 monetary prize to be used in furtherance of the winner's perioperative career, professional development, study or research including travel costs and personal expenses related to supporting these activities. Nomination forms can be downloaded from the SAPNA website www.sapna.org.au.

You may self-nominate or nominate a worthy colleague. If nominating a perioperative nurse for this award, please ensure you have spoken to the nominee prior to submitting the nomination and have gained their consent.

The nominator must state in writing, in 500 to 1,000 words, details of how the nominated perioperative nurse has demonstrated excellence in perioperative nursing in relation to Care, Vision and Excellence. Attach your submission and provide supporting evidence (if required) to this nomination form.

Nominations must be received by the SAPNA Secretary by **31th August**. A confirmation of receipt email will be forwarded to both the nominator and nominee.

Nominations will be judged by a SAPNA Awards sub-committee. The winner will be announced at the SAPNA Conference /Country Study events each year.
