<u>There were also several questions asked on our Feedback forms which we have</u> provided answers to:

- **1. What's new in ACORN Standards?** ACORN disseminates information via emails and social media to members re the standards and other business.
- **2. Follow up on Allergy / Alerts talk etc.** Ask your managers for this information as it should be reflected in your own policies and procedures at your hospitals.
