ANUM Beth Jennings stepped us through the Critical incident stress management program at SALHN.




Dr Michelle Perugini was our keynote speaker on day 2 who discussed how we can work with Artificial Intelligence, and not against it.

Judith Berry Perioperative Nurse Excellence Award

Every year the Judith Berry Award is awarded to a Nurse who has demonstrated excellence in Perioperative Nursing in relation to Care, Vision and Excellence. The Award is a \$500 monetary prize to be used in furtherance of the winner's perioperative career, professional development, study or research including travel costs and personal expenses related to supporting these activities.
